

AVIATION FUEL PRICING POLICY
GRANBY/GRAND COUNTY AIRPORT

Grand County owns and operates the aviation fuel system at the Granby/Grand County Airport. According to industry standards, unmanned airports place \$.50 to \$1.00 per gallon charge on the wholesale price of fuel in order to cover maintenance and operation costs. In 2012, Granby/Grand County Airport required \$.60 per gallon dispensed in order to cover the cost of maintenance and operation of that airport. However, this amount can vary from year to year based on the total amount of fuel sold.

In order to determine a competitive and fair price for aviation fuel at the Granby/Grand County Airport while supporting the economic viability of the airport, and considering the impacts to the County budget of the airport, the following policy has been adopted by the Board of County Commissioners. This policy may be changed from time to time as the Board of County Commissioners deems necessary and appropriate.

Every week the price of 100 LL and Jet A at the Granby/Grand County Airport will be compared and evaluated against airports of similar size and elevation in Colorado to determine what the market is offering. The price of aviation fuel at the Granby/Grand County Airport will be marked up no more than \$.60/gallon or no less than \$.40/gallon in order to maintain a competitive price. The price of aviation fuel will be changed every other week as necessary to meet this policy EXCEPT that if during this weekly evaluation, the price of 100 LL and Jet A is \$0.10 higher or lower than the average of the comparative airports, the price will be changed at that time. The County Manager, who is also the Airport Manager, will be responsible to make sure the appropriate changes are made.
