Grand County – General Election – November 8, 2016

1	What is in my ballot packet? <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Your Official Ballot• A Secrecy Sleeve• These Voter Instructions• An Official Return Envelope
2	How do I vote my ballot? <p>Follow all of the voting instructions on your ballot. After you vote:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Refold your ballot.2. Place your ballot and ballot stub inside of the Secrecy Sleeve. A stub that falls off a ballot does not mean the ballot will be invalidated. Insert the detached stub in your secrecy sleeve with your ballot.3. Place the Secrecy Sleeve and ballot in the Official Return Envelope.4. Sign and date the Self-Affirmation located on your own Official Return Envelope. See the example above. <p style="text-align: right;">X <u><i>Your Signature</i></u></p>
3	Reminders <p>The Official Return Envelope may only contain your ballot. If you include another voter's ballot in the same envelope, none of the ballots will count.</p> <p>The ballot stub should be returned with the ballot. A stub that falls off a ballot does not mean the ballot will be invalidated. Insert the detached stub in your secrecy sleeve with your ballot.</p> <p>You must sign the Self-Affirmation for your ballot to count.</p>
4	How do I return my ballot? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mail it back, Drop it off at a county-controlled drop box, or Deliver it to a Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC)
5	Important information <p>The County Clerk's Office must <u>receive</u> your ballot by 7:00 PM on Election Day. Postmarks do not count.</p> <p>The US Postal Service (USPS) needs time to process and deliver your ballot. Therefore, we recommend personally delivering your ballot to any of the locations listed below. It is a violation of law to receive more than ten ballots for mailing or delivery in any election.</p> <p>If you do return your ballot through the USPS, you must affix postage to your envelope. ADA accessible voting machines are available at the VSPC listed.</p>
