


A "yes" vote on any ballot issue is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no" vote on any ballot issue is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

Shall there be an amendment to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning limits on government charges, and, in connection therewith, reducing vehicle ownership taxes over four years to nominal amounts; ending taxes on vehicle rentals and leases; phasing in over four years a \$10,000 vehicle sale price tax exemption; setting total yearly registration, license, and title charges at \$10 per vehicle; repealing other specific vehicle charges; lowering the state income tax rate to 4.5% and phasing in a further reduction in the rate to 3.5%; ending state and local taxes and charges, except 911 charges, on telecommunication service customer accounts; and stating that, with certain specified exceptions, any added charges on vehicles and telecommunication service customer accounts shall be tax increases?

**MULLIGAN, LITTLE PIERRE, RAINBOW, BROOKY, AND A PORTION OF BALSH LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT REFERRED MEASURE 1A**

SHALL GRAND COUNTY, COLORADO DEBT BE INCREASED BY NOT MORE THAN \$1,940,000.00 WITH A REPAYMENT COST OF NOT MORE THAN \$2.5 MILLION, AND SHALL PROPERTY WITHIN THE MULLIGAN, LITTLE PIERRE, RAINBOW, BROOKY AND PORTION OF BALSH LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT IN GRAND COUNTY, COLORADO, BE ASSESSED 10 ANNUAL PAYMENTS OF NOT MORE THAN \$250,000.00 ANNUALLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING AND REFINANCING STREET IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE DISTRICT INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ROAD PAVING AND CONSTRUCTION AND ALL OTHER NECESSARY, INCIDENTAL, APPURTENANT, AND CONVENIENT FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT, LAND AND PROPERTY RIGHTS, TOGETHER WITH EXTENSIONS OF AND IMPROVEMENTS TO SUCH ROADS, WITHIN AND WITHOUT THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT; AND SHALL SUCH ASSESSMENT BE IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH DEBT OR ANY REFUNDING DEBT WHEN DUE; SUCH DEBT TO BE EVIDENCED BY BONDS, NOTES, CONTRACTS, LOAN AGREEMENTS OR OTHER FORMS OF INDEBTEDNESS OR MULTIPLE FISCAL YEAR OBLIGATIONS BEARING INTEREST AT A MAXIMUM NET EFFECTIVE INTEREST RATE NOT TO EXCEED 15.00%; SUCH DEBT TO BE SOLD IN ONE SERIES OR MORE, ON TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GRAND COUNTY, COLORADO MAY DETERMINE, INCLUDING PROVISIONS FOR REDEMPTION OR PREPAYMENT PRIOR TO MATURITY WITH OR WITHOUT PAYMENT OF THE PREMIUM; AND SHALL THE EARNINGS FROM THE INVESTMENT OF THE PROCEEDS OF SUCH DEBT AND ASSESSMENT REVENUES BE COLLECTED AND SPENT WITHOUT LIMITATION OR CONDITION, AS A VOTER-APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION OR ANY OTHER LAW?

**EAST GRAND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 REFERRED MEASURE 3B**

SHALL EAST GRAND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 DEBT BE INCREASED \$4,000,000, WITH A REPAYMENT COST OF UP TO \$8,600,000, AND SHALL DISTRICT TAXES BE INCREASED BY UP TO \$350,000 ANNUALLY (PROVIDED THAT SUCH AUTHORIZATION IS EFFECTIVE ONLY IF AMENDMENT 61 IS APPROVED BY THE VOTERS OF THE STATE ON NOVEMBER 2, 2010), FOR THE PURPOSE OF CREATING A RESTRICTED RESERVE TO ALLEVIATE THE ANNUAL TEMPORARY CASH FLOW DEFICITS REALIZED BY THE DISTRICT DUE TO THE RECEIPT OF PROPERTY TAX REVENUES LATE IN THE DISTRICT'S FISCAL YEAR; BY THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, NOTES, OR OTHER MULTIPLE-FISCAL YEAR FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS WHICH SHALL BEAR INTEREST, MATURE AND BE SUBJECT TO REDEMPTION, WITH OR WITHOUT PREMIUM, AND SHALL BE ISSUED AT SUCH TIME OR TIMES, AT SUCH PRICES (AT, ABOVE OR BELOW PAR) AND IN SUCH MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH TERMS, NOT INCONSISTENT HEREWITH, AS THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY DETERMINE; SHALL AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES BE LEVIED IN ANY YEAR, WITHOUT LIMITATION AS TO RATE AND IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH DEBT AND TO FUND ANY RESERVES FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF; AND SHALL THE EARNINGS (REGARDLESS OF AMOUNT) ON THE INVESTMENT OF THE RESTRICTED RESERVE AND THE REVENUES FROM SUCH TAXES CONSTITUTE A VOTER-APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE?
