## RESOLUTION NO. 2014-7-2-7

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF GRAND, STATE OF COLORADO APPROVING AND ADOPTING A NON-MAINTAINED COUNTY ROADS POLICY FOR GRAND COUNTY, COLORADO, EFFECTIVE JULY 15, 2014

WHEREAS, Ed Moyer, Assistant County Manager, presented to the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Grand, State of Colorado a proposed Non-Maintained County Roads Policy for Grand County, Colorado, a copy of which is attached hereto and is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, on a case by case basis, the Board has at times provided material, labor or both to assist residents in the maintenance of non-maintained county roads; and

WHEREAS, Grand County will no longer provide material, labor or assistance to maintain non-maintained county roads; and

WHEREAS, the Policy is designed to provide service in a fair and consistent manner and not to compete with private enterprise; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Grand, State of Colorado that the Non-Maintained County Roads Policy for Grand County, Colorado be and is hereby approved and adopted, effective July 15, 2014.

## NON- MAINTAINED COUNTY ROADS

Grand County maintains over 700 miles of public roads. Within its system are public roads which are not maintained and classified as **Non-Maintained County Roads**. These non-maintained county roads do not meet county road standards and could not be considered for maintenance until brought up to county standards and approved by the Board of County Commissioners during an annual Road Hearing where the Board of Commissioners considers requests for maintenance based on recommendation by the Road and Bridge Superintendent.

Grand County has been asked numerous times over the years to provide material, labor or both to assist residents in the maintenance of non-maintained county roads. This was done on a case by case basis.

It is determined by the Grand County Board of County Commissioners that in order to provide service on a fair and consistent manner, and not to compete with private enterprise, Grand County will no longer provide material, labor or assistance to residents who may request this on non-maintained county roads. Private enterprise in Grand County can provide material and labor to complete this work and should be utilized.
